

XLRI - Xavier School of Management, a premier B-School, inaugurated the 5th batch of its postgraduate programme for Certificate in Entrepreneurship Management (PGP-CEM) at XLRI's **Entrepreneurship Development Centre** (EDC) in XITE campus, Gamharia. The new batch consists of 66 students shortlisted on the basis of a rigorous selection process. While half of the students are from Jharkhand, the balance is drawn from different parts of the country including as far as Jammu & Kashmir, on the one hand, and Tamil Nadu and Kerala on the other.


