The startup, which has a catalogue of 10,000 repair services across major brands, delivering features such as free home pickup and drop, standby mobile, two-day repair and 90-day after-service warranty, has witnessed five-fold revenue growth between July 2015 and March 2016, owing to an average month-on-month growth rate of 25 per cent.

"The quick employment survey has outlived its purpose. Now we have broad-based our focus keeping in mind the new realities of Indian economy," said labour secretary Shankar Aggarwal. "While manufacturing sector is important, ignoring the service sector will not give a complete picture of the employment generation in the country quarter-

In 2015-16, the manufacturing sector contributed 17.5% of the gross value added (GVA) which is representative of total national output of the economy, according to data available with the department of statissector contributed 53.4% of GVA.


