## **XLRI Announces Admissions to Virtual Interactive Learning (VIL) Programmes in Business Management (PGCBM) & Human Resource Management (PGCHRM)**

***The last date for online registration is 10<sup>th</sup> October, 2016***

29<sup>th</sup> July, 2016: **XLRI- Xavier School of Management**, one of India's premier B-Schools announces its admission to the Virtual Interactive Learning (VIL) **Postgraduate Certificate Programs for Business Management (batch - 31) and Human Resource Management (batch - 23)** courses.
